

Field Trips

Parents are asked to accompany their preschool child on field trips. JK and SK parents are encouraged to attend as field trips are fun for all. We usually meet at the location of the field trip. A small fee is sometimes associated with field trips, as charged by the location.

Medical and Health Information

Immunization records are required to be up to date upon enrollment. Please advise us of any changes during the year. Children are not able to come to class if they have a communicable infection. If your child is ill, please notify the school. If your child requires an EpiPen, anaphylactic policies must be signed prior to school start.

We do not administer drugs, except in cases where an "Individual Action Plan for Child with Special Medical Conditions" form has been completed by parent/guardian.

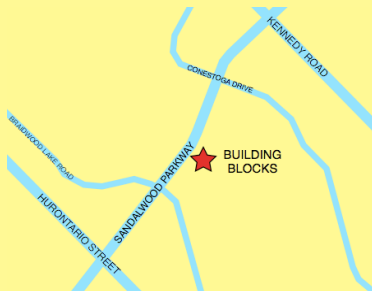
Variations in the Program

To enhance our program we have regular fitness days, special visitors and field trips planned throughout the school year. These excursions require parent involvement. For some trips, a small fee may be incurred.

Withdrawal Policy

Building Blocks Nursery School requires a minimum of one month withdrawal notice for pre-school programs and three months withdrawal notice for JK/SK programs.

Building Blocks Nursery School is licensed by The Ministry of Education. Our staff is made up of R.E.C.E teachers (Registered Early Childhood Educators) and experienced and dedicated pre-school teachers who enjoy working with young children.

Our Philosophy

At Building Blocks Nursery School (BBNS):

- *Our philosophy* is to encourage each child to develop their creative, cognitive and social abilities. The child's individuality and independence will be nurtured in a loving and kind atmosphere.
- *Our motivation* will be to have your child learn to share, co-operate and form trusting relationships with peers and teachers alike.

BBNS aims to provide a safe and happy environment for your child. Our program consists of age appropriate activities that enhance the development of:

- small and gross motor skills;
- creative, quiet listening, cognitive, and sensory skills; and
- dramatic play and free musical expression.

Each child will be encouraged to move freely through different activities.



Since 1986, we have acquired our successful reputation due to our continued commitment and dedication to the growth and healthy development of the children of this community.

Registration & Orientation Information

BBNS operates a half-day preschool and kindergarden program running from September to June.

Registration for the kindergarden program begins at the Kindergarden Information Evening held in January of each year. Registration for the preschool program begins at the Spring Open House held in March of each year.

Registration for both programs continue throughout the year based on availability. Families currently enrolled in the school will be given priority for the following year. Registration forms can be found online and must be accompanied with the registration fee.

- Eligibility: Children between 2 1/2 to 5 years are eligible to attend the school.
- Preschool children start school with shorter class times for the first (1 hour) and second day (1.5 hours) of school.
- All programs have an evening of orientation for the parents/guardians during the first or second week of September.

Enrollment Service & Termination

Parents of the preschool program agree to give BBNS one month's withdrawal notice or the following month fees. As of the first day of August, September's fee is nonrefundable. As of March first no fees are refundable.

Parents of the kindergarden program agree to pay BBNS fees three months in advance. September fees are due June first, monthly payments are due each month until March. Fees are non-refundable during the first three payment months (June, July, August) and the last three payment months (January, February, March) of each year. Parents agree to give three months withdrawal notice during the rest of the school year.

BBNS is not equipped to deal with significant learning disabilities or behavioral issues. If after six weeks or more we find that your child needs support in one of these areas we will review his or her enrollment in consultation with parents and or guardian.

Arrival & Departure

Food and Snack

Snack is provided each day. Our menu is posted on the Parent Bulletin Board. Birthday treats are welcome. We are a nut free school.

If your child has food allergies or sensitivities parents/guardians are required to approve the snack menus. All individual snacks for children with allergies must be labeled clearly with the child's name and class.



Fees and Payments

Fees are payable by 10 post-dated cheques and are due upon registration. Due to the nature of our program, fees are not refunded due to illness or vacation time. We are not open for two weeks over Christmas and one week for March Break. Please note a service fee will apply for NSF cheques. Parents/guardians are responsible to ensure contact information remains current.



Stay Up To Date

We encourage parents to read the Parent's Bulletin Board located in the foyer hallway. Daily activities, snack, a monthly calendar and information you may need to know is always posted there.

To ensure safe and efficient arrivals and departures each day, we ask the following guidelines be observed.

Arrival and dismissal:

- Children are dropped off at the appropriate classroom at 9:00 am or 1:00 pm.
- Dismissal times are 12:00 pm, and 4:00 pm.
- Dismissal times are prompt, late fees may be charged if applicable.
- Children can be released at any time during the program to parents/guardians or any person listed on registration forms under "Releasing Child".

Indoor Rules:

- No running or shouting in the halls.
- Children should bring a labelled bag packed with spare cloths to be hung on personalized hooks.
- No toys, books, etc. from home. It is important children learn the importance of sharing at school.
- All art work must be picked up on a daily basis as we have no facilities for storage. Remember to check the drying rack for paintings. Plastic bags work great for putting wet art work into.

Building Information:

- Observe ALL parking rules in the driveway. The first two spots are for church use only, 24 hours a day.
- Do not drop off or pick up in the driveway.
- The school is a smoke free environment.

Additional information:

- If you have any messages or concerns to pass on please speak to one of the staff at either arrival or departure times.

Getting Started

Guiding Your Child's Behavior/ Parent Involvement:

- If your child is hesitant about school and you wish to stay please feel free to stay for the duration.
- It is very disruptive to the class if you come and go.
- Speak to the teachers about your decision. You know what will work best for your child.
- The teacher's role in guiding the child's behavior is in a gentle and supportive manner.
- We encourage parents to participate in our program on interactive days, field trips, concerts and any relevant areas during the school year. We have had parents bring in objects from their homelands to show the children. We have had parents who are police officers, nurses etc. come to talk to the children, about their roles in the community.
- We value the input parents have in our school.

Hours Of Operation

Our hours of operation are Monday through Friday. The preschool program is 3 hours. The kindergarten program is 3 hours per day.

- Morning classes are from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm
- Afternoon classes are from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm.

The school term runs from the first Tuesday after Labour Day until the third week in June. The school will be closed for all Public School holidays excluding Professional Development (PD) days, one week in March and two weeks in December.

BBNS reserves the right to cancel any class due to lack of enrollment. However, if a class is cancelled, a place in another class may be offered.

What We Offer

2, 3, & 5 half day programs
for preschool, JK, & SK

Our preschool program provides a wide variety of activities to develop the interests of 2 and 3 year olds in a loving and nurturing environment. We cover all areas of childhood development in our curriculum. Younger children learn through their senses, thus we have a wide variety of sensory activities like play dough, sand, water, rice, and pasta. We encourage fine motor skills development with various simple first puzzles, lacing, cutting activities, and a daily "art" activity. In all areas of development we have progressive activities, with themes changing from week to week. The children are exposed to many different songs, finger plays and books, which enhances language. We have a block centre, discovery/science centre, dramatic/role playing centre, floor toys, and gross motor play equipment.

Our Kindergarten JK program incorporates the Jolly Phonics Reading Program and our small ratios enables us to focus on each student as an individual and work with them to help achieve their potential. Music, movement and overall child based learning strategies are incorporated into our daily program.

The Kindergarten SK children continue to enhance their learning in literacy with the use of Jolly Phonics and Jolly Grammar. This year is a year of incredible social growth for children. We are highly aware of this and build each day around positive social development
